MERCY TRIUMPHS OVER JUDGMENT - 11/10/2024

COMMUNION

- At some point during your gathering, take communion together.
- Read a Scripture about God's mercy or use Ephesians 2:1–8
- spend a moment in silence to experience the presence of Christ

REVIEW

- We all need wisdom from God. We receive the blessing that comes from wisdom only when we put it into practice
- God's primary or preferred character is loving, gracious, merciful and forgiving. But not at the expense of justice. He is the same person to everyone, with no favoritism.
- Moses responded to God's graciousness by interceding for sinful Israel to be forgiven. Jonah responded to God's grace by refusing to go to the people he wanted judged.
- James says yielding mercy and judgment with favoritism creates division and injustice in the church
- For examples, when we favor certain spiritual gifts over others, we often then favor the people with those gifts over those with less favored gifts hurting the community
- God prefers mercy over judgment, Therefore, we avoid judgment when we are merciful
- Jesus perfectly displays God's mercy and justice and He has no favorites.

DISCUSSION

- 1. How has your time been since our last gathering? How did you see God at work in you or around you?
- 2. Think of a previous season in your life that was marked with suffering (emotional, physical, and/or spiritual). Were you able to "consider it pure joy" at that time? What about now as you look back on that experience?
- 3. How might wisdom help you navigate difficulties and suffering better?

Read: James 2:1-13

- 4. What stood out to you from this week's teaching? Was there anything challenging, encouraging, or confusing to you?
- 5. Are you able to see any ways you might operate with favoritism rather than love in any of your approaches to relationships?
