“What Is The Gospel – What Jesus Accomplished”

1. Would you agree the “Good News” in the Gospel is what Jesus accomplished for you?

Reflect: Take a few moments to think about what Jesus has changed or is currently changing your life. Would you agree those are good changes for you?

📖 *Romans 1:16–17*

Personal Challenge: Write a short personal testimony of how Jesus has changed or is changing your life. Your testimony is a personal way to share “your good news” of the Gospel with someone you who does not yet know Jesus.

2. How do you see unbelievers? As *sinners in need of a savior* or as *orphaned children who need reuniting with their Heavenly Father*?

Reflect: In what ways might this shift in how you view an unbeliever affect the way you treat them? Would this shift in perspective give you more motivation to share the Gospel? 📖 *John 1:12–13*

Personal Challenge: Say this prayer everyday for a week, “Lord, give me one person I can share your love with today.” - Then look for opportunities all week to express a small act of love to the people you encounter.

3. Do you feel you are no longer a slave to sin and free from its guilt and shame?

Reflect: If your answer is yes, then please take a moment to offer the Lord a song or prayer expressing your thankfulness for what He accomplished for you. Feel free to lavish Him with praise and unrestrained gratitude!

📖 *Romans 6:6–7*
